Ned Clark introduced **Gary Baker** who owned Baker Media Solutions until 2010, when he joined the Energy Cooperative as the Director of Marketing and PR. Gary is very active in the Newark community and is on the board of the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Gary has been a member of the Newark Rotary Club since 1987 and was club president for 2011-12. He has been awarded the Rotarian of the Year and has received the Paul Harris Fellow award twice.

Gary shared about his involvement with and passion for adults with disabilities. Edgar Allen lost a son in a tragic streetcar accident in 1910 and became passionate about helping crippled children. He helped establish the Gates Hospital in Elyria and created the Ohio Crippled Children Association to help spread the word about the availability of help for crippled children. He became the first chairman. The organization grew and became Easter Seals. It is people like Edgar Allen and Paul Harris, the founder of Rotary International, who exemplify the Service Above Self qualities that embody the Rotary International organization. They knew that the Rotary organization needed to evolve and grow. In 1986, the Supreme Court ruled that the Rotary organization must admit women which was implemented immediately. Today the Rotary has 63% men and 37% women.

The theme of Rotary is that ALL BELONG and ALL ARE WELCOME. Doug encouraged every member of the UA Rotary to bring one guest to a meeting in the year 2025.

OCTOBER 29

Rotary International is working towards its \$1,000,000 goal for Easter Seals. The Easter Seals Gala will be held on Thursday April 24, 2025 in Newark with the Rotary District 6690 Conference being held Friday April 25 through Sunday April 27 at the Cherry Valley Conference Center in Newark.

Gary spoke about the importance of mental health and identifying depression. Gary himself was diagnosed with clinical depression several years ago. He is taking medication which has helped him greatly. Many suffer from mental health issues and we are currently in a crisis. It is critically important that we focus on identifying mental health and providing the treatment to help people. It is important to know and understand the Emotional CPR for Mental Health so that mental health issues can be identified and treated. What are the triggers? People need to know that it is OK to ask someone about how they are doing or feeling.

The district is working with Beth Johnson, executive director of Honor Flight Columbus, to help fund an Honor Flight in September 2025. The cost is approximately \$1000 per person for the trip.

Gary shared the story about Margaret and Delmas Gray who owned a grocery store. Their son Richard was born in 1954 and was found to be mentally ill. Unlike most parents faced with this challenge in those days, Margaret and Delmas
