Tom Westfall introduced today's speaker **Adam Carr**, Director of Innovation at Save A Warrior. Adam is a U.S. Army Combat Veteran and Special Forces Green Beret with over 12 years of service, having spent his military career hunting Al Qaeda Operatives, developing intelligence networks, conducting diplomatic relations, and briefing Ambassadors and Generals on Geopolitical Environments. Save A Warrior is a national organization dedicated to the prevention of veteran suicide and the preservation of life through the development and implementation of mental health and wellbeing initiatives. It is the premier organization in the entire country on suicide prevention.

Adam delivered a very interesting and compelling speech about his exceptional involvement in the military, and how that led to his subsequent commitment helping U.S. military veterans. 160,000 veterans have taken their lives since the Afghanistan/ Iraq wars, now 22 per day. Save a Warrior has transformed thousands of veteran's lives. Unlike

western medicine, Save A Warrior goes to the roots of the problems affecting veterans instead of treating the symptoms. This approach has brought extraordinary results, a 99.6% success rate with veterans who come to the organization suicidal. Save A Warrior is seeking supporters and Adam encouraged anyone interested in helping the cause to visit their office in Southern Ohio.
