Debbie Johnson introduced today's speaker **Lori Wengerd** (successful business owner and marketing & communication expert), who presented information about SCORE, a volunteer-only organization that provides mentors to new businesses to help them with their marketing and communications strategies, and ultimately grow into successful organizations. SCORE, which was started in 1964, is stronger and more relevant today than ever. SCORE offers free mentor sessions, webinars, and other instructional services and resources. These resources can be found on score.org.

Lori has been a volunteer mentor for SCORE for years, and shared direct feedback from business owners who have worked with SCORE, indicating the deep and significant impact the program can have on people, and how rewarding mentorship can be.

SCORE currently has approximately 11,000 volunteer mentors nationwide, but needs more volunteers. In Columbus alone, there are on average 110 requests for a mentor per month but not nearly enough volunteers. So, there is a big and immediate need for business mentors our area. Lori encouraged Rotarians with significant business experience to consider becoming a mentor. Mentoring has been extremely rewarding for Lori, and she asks that Rotarians please reach out to her for more information, or go online at score.org to apply to be a volunteer mentor.

After a brief Q&A, Andy Livingston then adjourned the meeting.
