ON THE WEB



Chris Reinhardt introduced Jay Moseley, the Head Men's Golf Coach at Ohio State University. Jay is in his tenth year as Head Coach and is coming off one of the team's best seasons in 45 years. The team advanced to the NCAA championship but ultimately lost to Auburn. Jay hails from Bainbridge, Georgia, and played golf at Auburn, where he was an All-American. He started his coaching career at Kennesaw State.

Jay's Father was a 35-year Rotarian, which made Jay appreciate what Rotary does for the surrounding community. Jay is the 11th golf coach at OSU and lives in UA. Jay addressed what a college golf coach actually does since he gets asked that from time to time. He stated that he puts together the practice and tournament schedule along with all of the team travel plans. Jimmy Beck is Jay's assistant coach who coached with him at Kennesaw State. Amy Miller is the director of Operations and helps with internal business and tournament play.

Jay talked about the recruiting schedule and noted it is the foundation of their program. Without it, he would have extremely limited success. There are different elements and phases of recruiting. He attends around 20 tournaments a year to scout players for the OSU team. He can then determine if that year's class will be stronger or weaker than another. He can communicate with athletes in the summer before their Junior year in high school. Hence, the list will begin to shrink as interest wains on either

party's side. Prospective athletes can then visit campus, and Jay stated this is where the magic happens as they get to see everything in person, and it pieces itself together so they can determine if this is where they can see themself for the next four years. This also allows Jay to see what their family dynamic is like, how hands-on or off their parents are, and how they will align with the core values of OSU golf.

Three new freshmen joined the team this year. Jay wants to help each athlete on their mission to become professional golfers, to be good students, young men, future husbands, and fathers, and to instill values to give back to their community. Jay enjoys spending four years with each athlete and seeing how they mature and develop as he establishes relationships with them.

Jay took questions from the crowd at this point in the talk. It was asked if weather plays a role in recruiting athletes to OSU. Jay informed the club that the Scarlett and Gray courses and the Ohio State Golf Club exist solely for the athletes to use most of the year. They also train at the Walter J Dennis Indoor Performance Center. That center houses Jay's office and the locker room; they have an indoor putting green so they can hit balls and putt indoors. There are also heated driving ranges off the back of the building. Jay thinks that OSU has the advantage of giving players a natural break rather than playing outdoors year-round. They play in the fall, take a winter break, and then start back up in February. This allows players to rest and not get burned out from year-round play.

It was asked if NIL got into NCAA golf. Jay says it has, but the situation is ever-changing, and he cannot comment on it.

It was asked how many scholarships they offer. The NCAA allows for 4 1/2 scholarships, which can be divided in different ways. There are very few full rides in his sport, but many half scholarships are offered to a broader range of athletes.

It was asked what the ideal parenting style is that you look for in recruiting an athlete. Jay responded that each young person is a byproduct of their surroundings and upbringing. He looks for good manners and how the athlete treats people with respect and graciousness. Sometimes, he can tell when a young man's chemistry is not right for the team and that he will not fit into the OSU culture. There are

only 10 guys currently on the team, so Jay protects the values of that group.

Someone asked about Neil Shipley and his transfer. Neil Shipley entered the transfer portal his junior year, and Jay initially dismissed him. However, he graduated in three years from James Madison and planned on getting a graduate degree at OSU, which meant he still had two years of eligibility left. Jay said he became an overnight sensation at OSU and is now having a lot of success at the professional level.


