his wife Jill, and all past District Governors at the luncheon joined Bart at the podium. Bart noted that Steve is joining Dick Slager, George Renkert, and Mike Knilans as club members who became District Governor. Bart asked all Rotarians to pledge to support Steve. Bart indicated that Steve is about to embark on a year that will be one of the highlights of his life. Bart also recognized the support that Jill will be providing Steve. The past District Governors passed Steve's District Governor pin among them and then to District Governor Tara. Bart then installed Steve Sandbo as our District Governor, and Jill presented the District Governor pin to District Governor Steve.
