Grant requests to help with community needs – with an emphasis on Upper Arlington-based needs – will be filtered through the committee. **INTERACT/FUTURE GENERATIONS COMMITTEE (ALAN YARLETTS, NED CLARK):** Alan summarized the Interact program at Upper Arlington High School and highlighted its growth over the past year. Goals for 2016-17 include: Identify students who want to engage in the community; promote community service to the student body; enhance the Rotary Youth Exchange Program; continue to focus on substance abuse prevention through things like the STAND program. The committee will also work to enhance participation at the middle school level. Club members were asked to recommend middle school students who might be interested in participating.

President **Chip Knoop** asked **Bill Mielke** to offer the Invocation and lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance.


There were no visiting Rotarians or guests at today's meeting which was held at Schmidt's Reception facility.
