President Chip introduced **Jeanette Bradley** of 2nd Chance Ministries, a street outreach for helping the hurting and loving the lost. The organization provides food, clothing, toiletries, and basic life necessities to the needy and homeless. Jeanette started the organization in 2003 and recently received a 501c3 charitable organization designation from the IRS.

Jeanette states that she has walked a mile, or more, in the shoes of almost everyone the organization serves. She grew up in Worthington, was abused in many ways as a child, and life led her to be homeless, an addict, an alcoholic, and a prostitute as she entered adulthood. After many difficult years Jeanette was moved by the message of Jesus Christ and was able to leave that life behind. Her life experience has given her the philosophy of never giving up on anyone because Jesus didn't give up on her. She shares her story with churches, schools, colleges, and in any public forum she can.

Twice a month 2nd Chance Ministries serves a homeless camp located behind the Franklin County Courthouse near where West Mound Street ends near the railroad tracks and the Scioto River. In addition to clothes and food, 2nd Chance provides batteries and small propane tanks. Importantly, 2nd Chance attempts to deliver hope and dignity in a loving way. Jeanette quoted Proverbs 31:8-9 which asks us to "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, ensure justice for those being crushed, speak up for the poor and helpless."

Human trafficking is an important issue that 2nd Chance Ministries strives to educate people about. Trafficking is the exploitation of women, children, and men for some sort of gain (often sexual and economic) through the use of force or abuse. Jeanette shared that trafficking isn't isolated to foreign countries or poor areas, there
