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

**Dave Dewey** introduced today's speaker **Gwendolyn Jackson** with Homeport. Gwendolyn is with Homeport's Advisory Center.

Homeport is a private non-profit organization which seeks to provide quality, affordable homes for low income people. The organization was started thirty years ago. Approximately 30 homes are sold per year.

Homeport's support activities for their clients can be categorized as either pre-purchase or post-purchase. Clients generally need help and guidance in areas such as personal finances, how to manage a mortgage and how to take care of the house itself.

Pre-purchase activities focus on education – including the provision of an eight hour HUD-certified course with the goal being certification for down payment assistance. The certificate expires after twelve months at which time the client would need to re-take the course.

Another pre-purchase program is the relatively new Home Readiness program. It includes ongoing follow-up and guidance to help people through the entire home-buying process. This program is six months old.

Gwendolyn observed that people generally know where they stand in terms of their ability to qualify for a mortgage and acknowledge that they need to make changes and adjustments.

Post-purchase activities include things such as providing help working with lenders in the event of

situational changes such as a job layoff or a death in the family. Referrals to programs such as the "Ohio Save the Dream" project are also possible.

Financial fitness classes supplement Homeport's many activities at both the pre and post-purchase stages. In addition, home repair workshops are offered through a cooperative arrangement with Home Depot. These workshops provide training in everything from lawn care to basic plumbing repairs.

Funding for Homeport comes from various grants and government funding as well as private donors. Clients are mostly low to moderate income people but there is no minimum or maximum income requirement. Potential clients are connected to Homeport through lender referrals in many cases.
