**Tom Davis** announced that our scheduled speaker for today, **Celeste Lauer** from the American Cancer Society was ill and unable to attend. Stepping up to fill in on a few hours' notice was **Carol Mohr**, Vice President of the Upper Arlington Board of Education.

Carol distributed information about the Upper Arlington Schools facilities master planning process which has been ongoing since January, 2015. The process was divided into three phases – assessment phase (2015), options phase (2016) and now the decision phase which should come to a conclusion by the end of this month.

She noted that the Upper Arlington School District is one of the fastest growing in the state. An article from the Columbus Dispatch highlighted this fact in a report published on December 26, 2016.

During this process a Financial Advisory Board was formed to review options for future facilities development and provide the School Board and staff recommendations about the proper course of action. The findings of the Financial Advisory Board were accepted by the Board of Education on June 6. A final vote on the question of placing a levy on the November, 2017 ballot will take place

on June 24. The proposal to be voted on includes a 3.75 mil operating levy and a bond levy for facilities construction and improvements.

She noted that the first phase of the facilities update process would include the construction of a new high school building with the main entrance facing Zollinger Road. The stadium will need to be relocated and other athletic facilities on the site will be relocated temporarily to facilities constructed on district-owned land at the Northam Park site.

Carol recounted some of the accomplishments of UAHS students which serve as evidence of the quality of educational opportunities in the District. Among the many highlights...

- The high school orchestra program was selected to perform at the 75th anniversary of Pearl Harbor in Hawaii.
- The girls' lacrosse team won its third consecutive state championship.
- The boys' lacrosse team reached the state semifinals this year.
- The school's C-Bus Hackathon team won and each member received a \$30,000 scholarship to Franklin University.
