**Brendan King** introduced the speakers, UA Police Officers **Jon Rice** and **E.J. Windham**.

Officer Rice became an officer with Upper Arlington in 2006, having had prior service with the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office. Officer Rice was selected from a highly qualified group of candidates to be our first School Resource Officer in 2014. At the time, he was primarily assigned to the Upper Arlington High School, but he was asked to provide programs from time to time at both Upper Arlington Middle Schools as well. As the SRO program has grown, Officer Rice has provided valuable input and advice to ensure the success of the program. Due to his efforts, Officer Rice was awarded the Upper Arlington Optimist Club Respect for Law Award in May of last year.

Officer Windham was hired in 2001 and spent a good deal of his career on third shift (midnights). He was assigned to the bike patrol and routinely served as one of our bike officers for the July 4th parade. In 2016 he was selected to serve as our DARE officer. In addition to his duties related to the DARE officer position, Officer Windham runs

the Safety Town program, and assists the Division with training needs to include less-lethal weapons, active shooter responses and unarmed self-defense.

As the SRO, Officer Rice's said his goal is to promote a safe school environment while providing an additional role model and support system for students. He also discussed the comprehensive student safety program at UAHS which includes:

- Swipe ID Cards
- Control of entry and exits
- Police Officer at front door
- Safety Resource Officers
- Cameras
- Trained staff
- Threat Assessment Team

Both Officer Rice and Officer Windham talked about the issues and curiosity (even at elementary schools) that arise with the popularity of "vaping" or use of electronic cigarettes. Vaping is the act of inhaling and exhaling aerosol or vapor produced by a device. Due to the rise in popularity of JUUL, a specific type of vape device, many teens are discreetly vaping flavored e-liquids with nicotine and marijuana. As a result, the police and school district have partnered with The Stand Project to educate parents and high school and middle school students on the dangers of adolescent vaping.
