Carolyn Casper, a one-term incumbent, has lived in UA for more than 60 years. She has experience in public auditing, legislative monitoring, and social services. She has been a board member of Leadership UA, has been involved with two revisions of the UA Master Plan, has served as a board member of the UAHS Alumni Association, has twice served on the UA Schools Strategic Planning Committee Member, has served on the Leadership Board of the Stand Project, has worked on local school levies and issues for over 30 years, and is a member of First Community Church. She has three daughters.

Michaela Burris has spent most of her career in the public sector including the U.S. Senate, Ohio Senate, and Ohio House of Representatives. She spent several years with Small Business Majority, a nonprofit organization advocating for public policy solutions to help small businesses. She is a lifelong Ohio resident and native of Northeast Ohio who studied at Ohio University and Capital University Law School, and she was raised by a single mother who immigrated from Germany. Her community involvement has included being an officer, director and member of Leadership UA, a member of

Equal UA, a member of the Friends of the UA Public Library, and a fellow of the Ohio State Bar Foundation. She was a varsity swimmer and diver in college. She lives with her husband Patrick and two dogs.

Angela Lanctot was raised in UA, attending Windermere Elementary, Hastings Middle School and UA High School. She graduated from Grove City College in Pennsylvania. Angela attained her law degree from Capital University Law School and became licensed to practice law in Ohio and Florida. She practices law at Kegler Brown Hill + Ritter. She has served as President of Kitchen Kapers, a UA organization dedicated to raising money to support services for cancer patients at OhioHealth Riverside Methodist Hospital.
