Our program today featured **Terry Starr**, Founder and Executive Director of Divine Dignity. We also met **Elizabeth Adams** from the Divine Dignity staff and **Elaine Pierce**, a board member.

Terry thanked UA Rotary for supporting the organization and for hands-on help in the assembly and delivery of personal hygiene bags to distribution centers in the area.

Divine Dignity was founded in November, 2022 when Terry became aware of the need for personal hygiene products in the array of services offered to people and families who are struggling. Food, shelter and rent are priorities but personal care products are often not part of the aid equation. Divine Dignity seeks to address that shortfall.

Hygiene products tend to be expensive and are essential to support self-esteem, good health and a sense of well-being. In its first year of operation Divine Dignity had helped about 600 families through the distribution of 300 hygiene bags per month. Overall, about 5,000 products are distributed per month.

It takes over 50 volunteers to operate Divine Dignity – including folks who assemble the bags to those who shop for products to be distributed and perform myriad other administrative duties. Acquiring products involves finding sources which offer discounted pricing or finding organizations willing to collect donated products. Divine Dignity, in cooperation with local churches and community centers, operates Hygiene Centers and Hygiene Closets.

Hygiene Centers are currently located in five Columbus Community Centers (Barack, Dodge, Douglas, Far East and Scioto Southland). Hygiene Centers are small marketplaces where community members can select six hygiene products once a month.

Hygiene Closets feature pre-assembled bags filled with six hygiene products which are provided once a month to community members. There are two types of bags – personal care or cleaning supplies. UA Rotarians recently assembled 500 bags in support of the effort. There are currently eleven Hygiene Closets in the Columbus area.

There is currently a long waiting list of organizations wanting to host a Hygiene Closet. Expansion of the program depends on increased support from partners willing to donate financially or to serve as hygiene product collection sites. Signage and collection bins are available from Divine Dignity.

Another component of the program is the "Digniteens" program. Described as teens helping teens, the program engages young people to give hygiene products to other teens along with a message of hope.

Terry shared a video featuring program background, highlights and testimonials.


