Andy Livingston and **John Adams** provided VERY important information about the financial footing of our club, and how it is funded.

There are three funds or accounts, and descriptions of these can be found every week in Rotary View:

- Upper Arlington Rotary Club Also called the "Club Account". All operating expenses flow through this account. The account is funded by non-tax deductible contributions from Members. Any surplus funds in the Club Account at end of year are transferred into the Rotary Founda tion Account to help fund charitable contribu tions. There are three sources of funds that provide revenue into the Club Account:
- a. Club Dues 85% of the total revenue, a portion of which go to Rotary International and Rotary District;
- b.Meals Since everyone is billed for meals whether they attend or not, meal revenues help provide extra funds for charitable donations and operating deficits (if any); and
- c. Annual Fundraiser Event Typical profit is between \$20,000 and \$75,000. The Fundraiser is critical to avoiding an operating deficit.
- 2. UA Rotary Foundation Contributions to this fund are tax deductible and are used to finance charitable contributions and grants. It also includes restricted member contributions (mostly for Guatemala project).

3.Rotary International Foundation – Also tax deductible, contributions to this fund help with Polio Plus and other International initiatives.

NOVEMBER

Currently, Our Club's contributions are exceeding the dollars we are bringing in. This is not sustainable if we want to continue the level of community support we have been providing in years past. That is why the strongly recommended annual contribution to the Rotary Foundation is more critical than ever. Pre-Covid, 80% of Rotarians met the \$250 commitment. That is now down to 47%, again, unsustainable.

To avoid the need to decrease funding to the Community Service Board, the UA Rotary Board has decided to adjust the annual ask from \$250 to \$365 (\$1 per day). It is the right thing to do to ensure sustainability and continue to provide support to those in need. Andy will be sending a letter to all UA Rotarians in early December regarding this important ask. "Service above self" is not just a tagline, it is what we should all be striving for as Rotarians.
