After showing the club a video of last year's trip to Guatemala and provided some background and updates on our Clubs work in Guatemala, Steve Sanbo and Dave McCurdy introduced today's speaker Erin Moody, the Director of our NGO partner Natun Guatemala. Erin expressed her gratitude for the extraordinary contributions our Club has made to support the important work Natun does every day in remote Guatemalan villages. Erin briefly shared information about the ongoing projects that are making a huge impact on Guatemalan children, women, and families. Natun focuses on three pillars, Education, Nutrition, and Economic Development. Besides opening and running much-needed preschools, Natun funds and operates programs involving Mother-Child Malnutrition, Preschool Nutrition, Elder Wellness, Youth Leadership, and Trade School & Entrepre-

neurship. Natun focuses on addressing the root causes of poverty and malnutrition by, for example, teaching women trades they can take to market to make money. With support of our Club, Natun is seeing SIGNIFICANT improved health outcomes for children, women and families.

Erin introduced Elena Wason, who will be taking over as Director of Natun in June. Elena shared her background, and spoke about the Strategic Plan she has been working on and will be implementing.
