Lieutenant Jon Wilhelm, UA Police Department was introduced by **Jeanine Hummer**. Lt. Wilhelm has been with the Upper Arlington Police Department since 1989. He was elevated to Detective in 1996, Sergeant in 2003 and Lieutenant in 2017.

Lieutenant Wilhelm began with a discussion of what constitutes a cold case. A cold case is a crime previously assigned to law enforcement that lacks a resolution. In UA, a case needs to have been closed for over a year before is considered a cold case. He described common characteristics of a cold case. They usually involve a violent crime; a suspect may be known but there is not enough evidence and it may be a case with no suspect even after thorough investigation.

There are a number of factors that could cause a case to be re-opened. For example, new witness testimony might arise (from friends who have become enemies or a witness or co-conspirator may need help from law enforcement. In this case, corroboration is especially crucial.) Other cases get re-examined when new personnel come to the department or a fresh set of eyes focuses on the case. Today, improved forensics are a big reason that cases are re-opened. Also, fresh activities of suspects – including criminal activity on their part – will often yield a reopening.

When a case is reopened or re-investigated a number of things occur. Among them are:

- A thorough review from A to Z of all known factors
- Review all physical evidence
- Involve prosecutor to comply with any changes in the law
- Look at perpetrator's motivation
- Complete background investigation (especially social media)
- Review Medical Examiner's report to determine death details
- Contact victim's family – being careful not to raise their hopes
- Interview peripheral individuals
- Suspect interview
- Team conferences with all parties involved in investigation

Jon shared a case study of a crime which was committed in 2003 and finally solved in 2017. A suspect attempted to light a fire near the gas pumps at a local station and then fired several shots at a bank building across the street. No matches to shell casings were found at the time of the crime. Fourteen years later an injured male was arrested for intoxication and, in the process of loading him into a medic a handgun fell out. He was ultimately arrested for having two handguns. Further tests on the gun matched the shell casings from the 2003 attempted arson and his fingerprints matched those found on the improvised explosive device he had used in the 2003 crime. A conviction for aggravated arson followed.

Finally, Jon discussed the status of the Asenath Dukat murder case. It was noted that a decision has been made to begin carefully releasing public records about the case.

Eight-year-old Asenath Dukat was murdered on June 3, 1980 while walking home from Barrington Elementary school. Her body was found at the southeast corner of Riverside Drive and Waltham Road. Hundreds of leads came in after the crime and all but a few were eliminated. The case was re-examined in 2008 with biological evidence. The evidence consisted of human bodily fluids determined not to be the victim's. A suspect #1 was identified as a result. That suspect died in the mid 1980's. In 2016 the case was re-examined and no other suspects have been identified. All leads have currently been exhausted. If any other leads arise they will be thoroughly examined.

During question and answers we learned that there is a "suspect #2". A similar assault occurred a month earlier, about a mile away on Canterbury Lane, that did not result in a murder. A second

suspect arose from that case. Due to the similarities in the cases it is possible that there was more than one person involved in one or both cases. While it is impossible to definitively say that there was only one person involved in the Dukat case it is possible to positively identify suspect # 1 as a person at the scene of the crime.

The name of suspect #1 has yet to be released. City officials are reluctant to release the name of the uncharged suspect at this time. There are potential liability issues with the release of such information and divulging it must be approached with utmost care.





UA ROTARY IN-PERSON MEETINGS UPDATED PROTOCOL

UA ROTARY TO RESUME IN PERSON MEETINGS IN JUNE

With Governor DeWine announcing that event facilities can resume catering and hosting groups of up to 300 beginning June 1, we are pleased to announce that UA Rotary will begin hybrid in-person/Zoom meetings at Scioto Country Club and the Schmidt's Reception House at Raymond Memorial in June. We are trying to be as thoughtful as possible in how we do this in order to provide the safest environment while continuing to provide the social interaction that has long been a hallmark of our club.

In order to follow state mandates and hold these meetings as safely as possible, for the time being the meetings will be somewhat different than what we've done in the past.

PROCESS

1. Due to physical limitations of the facility because of social distancing mandates, initially we will have a capacity of 50 members permitted to attend in-person at Raymond. The capacity at Scioto CC is yet to be determined.
2. Tables will be set up to allow for 6' separation of seats.
3. There will be a limit of four persons to a table with 6' of separation from each other.
4. We will maintain social distancing of 6' at meetings.
5. We will enter the meeting room and exit through different doors. Members should observe 6' distance when picking up and putting away their badge.
6. Greeters will maintain 6' separation and will offer waves and hellos instead of handshakes.
7. Masks are not required but are certainly permitted.
8. Meetings will be livestreamed on Zoom as we have been doing the last two months and members will be able to participate with announcements and questions for the speaker. We will have a video camera shooting the podium/speaker and what is going on on-site and the big screen at the venue will be showing our Zoom feed to create connection between those on-site and those participating remotely.

2. Due to the fact that our initial on-site capacity is 50 persons, members will be required to submit an online reservation to reserve a seat at lunch. An email invite will be sent and the reservation system will open at 3 PM one week prior to each meeting. The reservations will be accepted first come, first served. Reservations will close when capacity is reached or at 5 PM on the Friday preceding the meeting, whichever occurs first. Initially, we will not allow non-member guests to attend in-person unless they are the featured speaker or associated with our speaker. Members are welcome to invite guests to participate via Zoom.
3. Any member who reserves a spot for lunch will automatically be billed on their next quarterly dues statement for that lunch whether they attend or not. Please only make a reservation if you are going to be attending the meeting in-person.

FOOD/DINING

1. State mandates do not yet permit buffet dining so menus will be determined in advance and food and beverage service will be provided by servers at the facility.
2. Members with special dietary requirements (vegan, allergies, etc.) will be able to make special requests.

GENERAL

1. We will be resuming our regular schedule of weekly meetings beginning June 2nd.
2. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, suspect you could have COVID-19, or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, do not attend in person. Participate in meetings via Zoom until your health is cleared.
3. All data appears to show COVID-19 being particularly dangerous for the elderly and those with comorbidities. We strongly suggest that our older members and those members with existing health issues choose to participate in meetings via Zoom and do not attend in-person meetings for the time being.
4. The decision to attend in-person or via Zoom is a choice for each individual member to make. No member should feel compelled to attend in-person meetings until they feel comfortable doing so. For the time being, they will not be charged for lunch unless they make a reservation and they will not face attendance/engagement penalties for not attending in-person.
5. While the venue and the club will be doing all that can be done to provide a safe environment for those attending in-person, some risk is inherent and members should assess that risk for themselves.
