Jack Cotter introduced the speaker, Veeramani Karuppuchamy. Veeramani is a PhD student in Food Science and Technology and Graduate Research Associate at The Ohio State University. He has a Master of Science degree in the same field from OSU as well as a Master of Science degree from South Dakota State University in Agricultural and Biosystems, plus a Bachelor of Technology degree in Agricultural Engineering from Tamil Nadu Agricultural University.

In his academic and professional career, Veeramani has developed specialties in these fields in food science: food production, quality assurance/ quality control, research & development, HACCP (hazard analysis and critical control points), GMP (good manufacturing practice), SSOP (sanitation standard operating procedures), process engineering and extrusion. He has worked as an Assistant Professor at Tamil Nadu Agricultural University and has held various positions in the food science industry around the U.S., including in Wisconsin, Minnesota, South Dakota and Alaska.

Veeramani presented on the topic of food sustainability and its strategies and challenges. Food sustainability entails a food system that delivers food security and nutrition for all in such a way that the economic, social and environmental bases to generate food security and nutrition for future generations are not compromised. This means that the system is (1) profitable throughout (economic sustainability), (2) has broad-based benefits for society (social sustainability); and (3) has a positive or neutral impact on the natural environment (environmental sustainability).

Veeramani left us with these conclusions: (1) Sustainability is needed to meet the needs of today without negatively affecting tomorrow, (2) reducing food waste is an effective way to improve sustainability, (3) sustainability is a team effort involving producers, processors, and consumers, and (4) challenges are inevitable but need to be overcome.

Milt Lustnauer announced approval by the Club board of grants for the following organizations: A Kid Again (\$5,000), and Birdy Box (\$2,000). There was also a confirmation of the Club's commitment to providing support to Natun Guatemala from various sources in the total amount of \$65,000. The budget for support of the Club's work at West Broad Elementary School has also been increased.

Milt also noted the social event taking place on June 12, starting at SoW Plated and moving to 3-4 other restaurants.

Milt also noted that several members are late in paying their quarterly dues, and asked that everyone keep current with dues.
