Jessica Grisez was pleased to introduce **Lillian Zarzar**. Lillian is a coach, speaker and business consultant that specializes in the development of self-expression. She announced, "I am changing the world through all of you." Her background includes an Undergraduate Degree from Ohio University and a Masters from Bowling Green. She is a Certified Speaking Professional and has delivered her presentations to a variety of audiences including businesses and clubs.

Zarzar expressed that our world is changing faster and faster every day. AI is transforming our world. As a professor, she has seen Chat GPT produce papers required by her students. I want my students to add their personal touch to their AI produced work, as AI is here to stay.

Information in our world is doubling every 73 days. She explained if you are busy with now, you can't plan the future. This is changing how we do business, and this change is constant. Successful businesses are balancing People, Process and Culture. "Think outside the box? What box?" Boxes are limits created by each of us. She explained that each of us actually embrace change. We try new restaurants, new clothes, and travel destinations. However, we inherently don't like having change forced on us.

Common challenges for businesses in 2023 include rapid growth, news distractions, unclear challenges of change, and shifts in labor markets. This is forcing successful leaders to become more interactive. It is important to listen to team members and clearly communicate purposes. Team members must understand "the why" with accountability and acknowledgement of each process step. "Include your team in making certain decisions with trust and acceptance," she stated.

Zarzar highlighted the success of coaches replacing managers in a company. Productivity grew 20%. Her slide depicted a water glass that is half full, or half empty. Which is it? It is actually both. However, you view the glass, you must remember to others it is opposite your view. Leaders must accept this premise and manage accordingly to facilitate view of their organizations. She concluded that Rotary is Leadership, and our members will drive the future.

Personal interaction is still needed, but personal interaction is happening in a high-tech world. Teleconferences and online meetings included people from all over the world. Technology is bringing the world together.

Technology is changing rapidly. PC's required their own room in 1972. Now we carry it in a Smart Phone. We can connect literally to the world to watch a live show.
