Matt Hare introduced the speaker, **Scott Gaines**, Chief Operating Officer of CoverMyMeds, where he was previously senior vice president and general manager of provider solutions. He joined CoverMyMeds in 2014.

Prior to joining CoverMyMeds, Scott spent nine years with Hyland Software in implementation, consulting and business development roles. He helped lead the expansion of Hyland's healthcare practice into international market and advised healthcare organizations in Europe, the Middle East, Australia and Asia.

Scott is active in the health IT industry and has served as a member of the Innovation Committee of the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society, a board advisor to Central & Southern Ohio chapter of HIMSS, and an advisor to the Technology Development Fund at Nationwide Children's Hospital. He is currently serving on the Board of Trustees of the Columbus Metropolitan Library Foundation.

Scott is a graduate of Miami University. He and his wife and daughter became residents of Upper Arlington about 1 1/2 years ago.

Scott spoke about the "growth story" of CoverMyMeds (hereafter "CMM"). CMM was founded in 2008 by UA resident Matt Scantland and pharmacist Sam Rajan. It is one of the fastest growing healthcare technology companies in the U.S.; it had 80 employees when Scott joined it in 2014 and now has more than 1,500.

CMM's services connect the healthcare network and help patients get the medications they need to live healthy lives, increasing speed to therapy and reducing prescription abandonment. CMM's network includes more than 500 electronic health record systems (EHRs), 60,000 pharmacies, 750,000 providers and most health plans and PBMs. CoverMyMeds solutions work for all drugs and all health plans and pharmacy benefit managers. CMM's electronic services, including prescription decision support, electronic prior authorization and specialty support services are available at no cost for health care providers, pharmacists and their staff.

Scott also described CMM's new campus that is being built in the Franklinton neighborhood. CMM saw this area as one that could benefit from the development, and it is also a place where many employees volunteer. Scott noted two major design elements in the development of the campus: all employees will have a view of the outdoors, and there will be significant spaces that are accessible to the public.
