Mike Kull introduced Program Speaker, **Amy Klaben**. Her bio includes a Partner Attorney with Porter-Wright and multiple boards and organizations. Her program is an update to initial funding request from UA Rotary three years ago. Move to Prosper received a \$2750 initial support from our club. This contribution was used to print their first handbooks for their program.

Move to Prosper is a program for struggling families to achieve socio-economic mobility through a three-year strategic process. Participants are required to fulfill requirements and coaching in order to remain in the program.

The program addresses housing, work training, a family education. Pilot families increased their income by 58% that should result in an additional \$300,000 in career earnings. Move to Prosper offers rent assistance to move families to better housing and better schools. They work with Landlord partners that have very supportive of the initiative.

Four Components of the Model:

- Housing in higher rent areas resulting in safer housing.
- Individual Life Coaching
- Monthly required programs for finance and life skills.
- Two-Generation Education -Moms and Children

Life Coaching Pillars:

- Housing Stability
- Financial Capability
- Health and Wellness
- Develop Savings Plan

Amy explained that typically around nine months into the program, the transformation begins. She highlighted the results of Tobias, Oley and Titus. They are the children of a family that has been through the program and shared the results of their transformation to a stable family. She also told of a woman that completed training to get a Commercial Driver's License and her ability to earn wages she didn't believe were possible.

Ways to Help:

- Fund a Family
- Volunteer
- Introduce a Landlord

Move to prosper will not accept a family until their funding is secured. Their goal is to support 16 families, two times per year.

Q&A

- There program began with 10 families.
- Landlords are asked to help coach. They share how to be a good tenant and are also required to attend a training session. They typically like the stability of a three-year renter.
- Cost is \$6200 per person per year. There are some government grants available, but the organization still needs to provide 50% of the cost.
